

STEAM-TO-CAREER COLLABORATIONS

K-8 Teachers & Parents

Students always ask, "Why am I learning this? When am I going to use this?" AWT STEAM-to-Career collaborations allow teachers to see and experience how the state educational standards connect directly to local industry. AWT WORKADVANCE

The AWT WorkAdvance program aims to introduce job seekers to entry-level positions in manufacturing through a short training program at our facility. Each day, a new topic relating to the manufacturing sector is covered. The program includes days focused on blueprint reading, inspection and measurement, shop math, and intro to manual and CNC machines. We cover resume and interview prep, financial literacy, and workplace etiquette. At the conclusion of the program, participants are matched with manufacturers for interviews.


AWT TRANSFORMATION TRAINING CENTER
